The Ebacc is not a qualification in its own right – it's a combination of GCSE subjects that includes a language, that offer an important range of knowledge and skills for young people.

The Department for Education recommend these core subjects, which make up the Ebacc:

- English Literature
- English Language
- Maths
- Science
- History or Geography
- Language (at MHS at that is French)

The government's ambition was to see 75% of pupils studying the EBacc subject combination at GCSE by 2022, and 90% by 2025.

- **5.Global Awareness**: History and Geography increase understanding of the world and current issues.
- **6.More Opportunities**: Keeps future education and career options open.
- **7.Government Support**: Backed by the UK government, ensuring quality education.

HELP YOUR CHILD MAKE THE BEST GCSE CHOICES

You and your child may currently be considering, with advice from their school, what GCSE subjects they should take next year.

The Department for Education recommends these core subjects, which make up the English Baccalaureate (EBacc), and help keep options for young people open:

English language and English literature

- Maths

-Science

Combined science or 3 single sciences from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Computer science

- History or Geography

- A language Ancient or modern

WHAT IS THE EBACC?

The EBacc is not a qualification in its own right – it's a combination of GCSE subjects, including a language, that offer an important range of knowledge and skills to young people.

EBACC FUTURE PROOFS YOUR CHILD'S PROSPECTS

While your child may not have decided on their future career path yet, choosing the EBacc at GCSE gives them access to a full range of employment options when they leave secondary school and the broad knowledge that employers are looking for.

If they are thinking of going to university, the EBacc is also recommended by Britain's most prestigious universities.





The research found that students studying EBacc subjects for GCSE, were more likely to stay in education after 16.

LANGUAGES GIVE YOUNG PEOPLE A COMPETITIVE EDGE

Languages are an important part of EBacc. Studying a foreign language can be extremely rewarding and exciting. They provide an insight into other cultures and can open the door to travel and employment opportunities. They can also broaden pupils' horizons, helping them flourish in new environments.

If your child finds languages difficult, don't forget that they will have been studying them for much less time than their other subjects and, while it can be a challenge, learning a language will greatly enhance their future opportunities.

What's more, we know that employers value languages, as they are increasingly important to make sure we can compete in the global market. Because of this, languages are increasingly becoming a requirement for many graduate schemes, such as those offered by Lidl. "Having language skills under your belt will help make you stand out from the crowd, whether you're applying for an entry level position, a management role or an internal transfer."

WHAT ABOUT ARTS AND MUSIC?

While arts and music are not included in the EBacc, every child should still experience a high-quality arts and cultural education throughout their time at school as part of a balanced curriculum. If your child can take 9 GCSEs, they will have either 1 or 2 further options and can choose subjects based on their wider interests like art or music as well as others such as physical education or technology.

Schools where more pupils select the EBacc at GCSE maintain the number of pupils that select arts.


Curriculum depth

At KS3, we offer the broadest possible curriculum. At KS4, the curriculum is much more specialised with more teaching time in each subject leading to a greater depth of study.

At Martin High School, learners take 8 GCSEs (9 for Triple Science candidates).

Colleges, universities and employers do not require more than 8 GCSEs.

- For university entrance in the UK, most universities typically require at least five GCSEs at grades 4-9, including English and Maths.
- For local colleges, such as WQE and BCSF, generally you need at least five GCSEs at grades 4-9 (A*-C), including English Language and Maths.






- Subjects can only operate subject to sufficient numbers picking them
- The system is not run on a "first-come-first-served" basis, it will depend on the combination of subjects chosen
- If a learner does not complete their online form by the deadline we cannot guarantee any of their choices
- In cases where learners are not successful getting their first choice, we will always look to give them their reserve choices where possible

- √ Think carefully about which subjects you have enjoyed and been successful in so far
- ✓ Use the online videos, the options booklet and conversations with parents and teachers.
- ✓ Think about you're plans post-16 and how certain subjects may complement your A-Level, vocational choices or what apprenticeship or job you may be considering in the future
- X Don't just go with what your friends think
- X Don't look for an "easy option", it is a myth to think some subjects are easier





Learners will be sent an invitation email to their MHS learner account. Access using network username and password







Ebacc Pathway pre-selected option


If your son/daughter has been selected on the Ebacc pathway French will be pre-selected, the info bar will read 'You have chosen 1 of 1'








By clicking the appropriate subject the subject will turn blue and will read: 'You have chosen 1 of 1'








By clicking the appropriate subject the subject will turn blue if selected as a choice and orange if selected as a reserve choice
