

EXAM INFORMATION



- Two hour long revision sessions are planned before each exam
- Otherwise learners continue to attend their timetabled lessons
- Revision rooms will be in place for subjects where the exam has already been sat
- Breakfast will be served from 8.30 8.45am in the barn where teachers of the exam subject will be based for reassurance and last minute questions
- Learners will be reminded to go to the toilet, store their belongings and line up for the exam
- Absent learners will be contacted ASAP

PUNCTUALITY AND ABSENCE



- If a learner is more than 30 minutes late to an exam, they will not be admitted
- However, even being 5 minutes late disrupts the other learners
- If you are ill, you must inform the school before the exam is due to start. Notifications received afterwards won't count.
- Unless it is absolutely impossible for your child to attend, they should always try to sit their exams.







Students studying for their GCSEs, A levels and vocational qualifications will be preparing to sit their exams this summer. We know that there may be instances where students contract the virus during the exam period, as we continue to live with COVID-19.

Here we look at what students should do if they feel unwell or receive a positive Covid test result while taking their exams.

Exams have been spaced by a minimum of ten days between the first and last exam in any subject, to reduce the chance of students missing all exams in a subject because of illness.



Parents should, wherever possible, encourage their children to attend their exams. However, there may be exceptional cases though where this will not be possible, e.g., a temporary illness on the day of the examination.

Will I have to provide proof of a positive Covid test if I fail to sit an exam due to Covid?

No - there is no requirement for you to complete a COVID-19 test to provide evidence of your absence from an exam.



Instead, the JCQ awarding bodies will be adapting 'Form 14 -JCQ/ME - Self-certification for candidates' who have missed an exam to assist centres in dealing with candidates who are absent from an exam for an acceptable reason in line with the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) guidance.

You and your parents/carers/guardians will need to complete the relevant sections of the form and the centre can then verify your circumstances, where provided in Form 14, to process an application for special consideration using the category 'absent candidate'.



I have taken a COVID-19 test under the direction of my GP and have a positive test result, what should I do?

The <u>UKHSA guidance</u> is that you stay at home and avoid contact with others for **3 days** (if 18 and under) or **5 days** (if 19 or older) after the day you took the test.

Your centre will ask you to self-certify the reason for absence using Form 14. You are not required to provide proof of a test but could keep a record of the test, such as a photograph, as evidence if it is available.

Your centre will then submit an online application for special consideration to the relevant awarding bodies using the category 'absent candidate'.



Black tailored



trousers.

These should NOT be:

- Skinny fit
- Jeans or jeans style
- Chinos
- Leggings
- Jogging bottoms

Black with the Martin High School emblem.

This should be worn at all times within school, including to and from school.

Blazers may only be removed with direct permission from a member of staff.

A white stiff collared shirt.

This should be tucked in at all times.

The school tie.

This should be worn at all times

Optional clothing.

V-neck jumper or cardigan. This must be plain black and worn underneath the school blazer.

Cold weather clothing. Warm waterproof coat, hat, gloves, scarf. Coats should be worn over the blazer during periods of cold or wet weather. Coats must not be worn inside the building.



Black knee length skirts.

Pleated skirts are

recommended and should be worn with plain black tights.

Skirts should NOT be:

- High-waisted
- Made from stretchy material

Black shoes or trainers



These should be plain black and must NOT have:

- A coloured sole
- A colourful or eyecatching logo.
- Coloured laces



Hoodies are NOT allowed to be worn in school at any time.



TOILETS



- Learners have to be escorted to the toilet, one at a time. In some rooms they will have to wait for the roving invigilator to come.
- This is very disruptive to other learners so must be kept to a minimum and should only happen in longer exams

MARKING




- The papers are scanned in by the exam boards
- Markers work on screen, not with the actual paper
- Presentation is important, handwriting must be legible
- Do not use tippex or highlighters on your work. Highlighters can be used to highlight key words in the question only.
