Food and drink

We offer a wide selection of food for breakfast, break, and lunchtimes. Our range includes:

- **Breakfast:** Full English breakfast, hot croissants, pastries, toasties, and paninis.
- Lunch and Break: An extensive range of hot and cold food, street food and salad bar is always available.

We cater to various dietary needs, including halal, gluten-free, vegan, and dairy-free options.

Students can purchase food and drink with their ID cards, which can be topped up on Beehive (Find out more on page 7).

Learners can access food from the Snack Shack and the canteen. There are multiple benches around the campus for socialising and eating. Additionally, we have two undercover barns and open the main hall for table seating during lunch. Various classroom-based clubs are available where learners can eat while participating, such as Maths Club, Computer Club, Library, and Football in the sports hall

Pastoral support

Pastoral support is at the heart of everything we do at Martin High. We have an extensive pastoral team, starting with our tutor's who are a key point of contact each morning for all our learners. We also have pastoral managers who are non teaching and are located in the pastoral office on the main corridor, they are often out and about visiting lessons. Your Child's Head of year is another key person who can support your child pastorally and is located in the pastoral office between lessons.

Uniform

Students in KS3 at Martin High School wear a uniform. Our uniform can be purchased from Schoolwear Solutions (either at the shop in Oadby or ordered online).

All students are to wear the following:

- School Blazer -It is to be worn to and from school and around school all day
- Tie & lanyard They should be worn at all times.
- White Shirt Formal in design and tucked into trousers/skirt at all times.
- Trousers Black formal, traditional style school trousers. (They should not be -Skinny trousers, jeans or jean-style, leggings or tracksuit bottoms). Black tailored knee length shorts are allowed.
- Skirts Black and pleated or flowing (no skin tight skirts- body con style) 90
 denier tights or plain black leggings must be worn under the skirt.
- Shoes/trainers Plain black no white soles.

Students PE Kit

- Martin High PE T-shirt- this must be worn by all learners
- Black joggers or black SPORTS leggings (If leggings are not sporty and/or seethrough you will be asked to change into spare PE kit)
- Shorts may be worn for PE (Not Lycra or stretchy material and must not be fitted. No cycling shorts or Nike Pro)
- Trainers Plain black no white soles.

If you wish to wear a jumper on PE days this can be:

- MHS sports jumper with the logo-this maybe worn during the PE lesson
- V neck jumper or cardigan -Plain black -To be worn under the school blazer not instead of the blazer, this must be removed for PE lessons
- · Hoodies are not permitted

Beehive



Beehive brings together essential applications, making it easy for parents and carers to access important information and updates about their child's education.

Available in both a browser and a smartphone app, Beehive ensures seamless access. Parents/carers will receive a unique welcome email with instructions on how to access the portal, while students can log in using their school network credentials.

Here's a round-up of what can be accessed via Beehive...

NEWS

See school news shared with both students and parents. This can include anything from clubs to competitions to reminders about school closures.



ASSIGNMENTS

can set class or group assignments and both students and parents can view details



TIMETABLES

Daily timetable information showing subject, room and location information.



EVENTS

The events module shows a planned schedule of after school events. Students can sign-up to extra-curricular activities and parents/ carers will be informed of any changes to events automatically.



BEHAVIOUR

Allows staff to instantly give reward and behaviour points. Parents can view their child's attendance and see reward and behaviour points given.



PAY & STORE

Parents/carers have the ability to top-up their

Frequently asked questions

Here are our answers, to what we find, are the most frequently asked questions.

What happens if my child is ill and/or can't attend school?

You need to contact school on a daily basis if your child is ill, we also have an attendance email address and online system to make communication with the school around attendance easier. If a child is off school for a prolonged period of time we would expect medical evidence from the doctors to support the absence.

What happens if my child is late?

If a learner is late to school, they will be directed to the main office, where they will be asked to sign in and issued with a C2 late and a 45 minute detention.

What subjects will they study and how is homework set?

Years 7 learners will study 6 x 50 minute lessons a day and will study a rich tapestry of subjects, laying the foundation for the prestigious English Baccalaureate should they wish to take this option.
